
Make sure your boots are 'worn in' Stop to treat them as soon as you feel any discomfort Carry some 'blister plasters' Don't pop them – they can get infected.

What is Lyme disease?

Lyme disease is an infection caused bybacteria called *Borrelia burgdorferi*(pronounced bore-EL-ee-uh burg-DOR-fer-rye). They belong to a family of bacteria calledSpirochaetes (SPY-roe-

keets), because of their spiral shape.

This is a highly magnified image of a group of*Borrelia burgdorferi* bacteria.



What happens when you get Lyme disease?

Some people, but not all, get a circular redrash (see photo below) that spreads out from the bite. Later, you might feel ill. You mightexperience:

- headaches
- stomach upsets
- feeling very tired
- pains in muscles and joints
- numbness or tingling feelings

Lyme disease can be mild, but it can also be very serious. Lyme disease doesn't always go away on its own, so must always be treated.



If you have any of these symptoms within about 6 weeks of the tick bite then see your doctor.


